In 1935 Sir Victor Goddard of the Royal Air Force was flying low in pouring rain over a disused First World War airfield in Scotland, near Edinburgh. Suddenly the scene was brilliantly lit- he thought bright sunshine had pierced a heavy cloud. Below were open hangar doors and four bright yellow aircraft three bi-planes of a model he recognised, and a monoplane unfamiliar to him.
